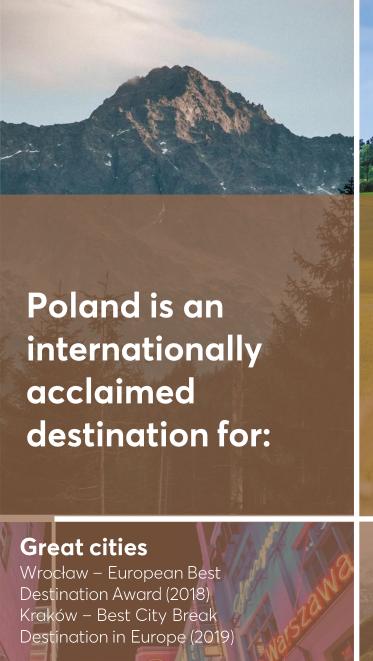

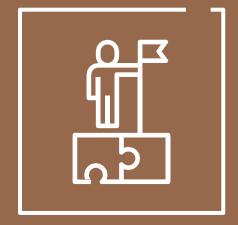




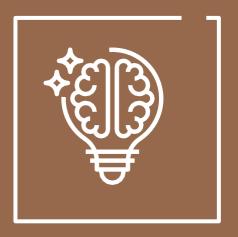

WHAT THE POLISH CONSTRUCTION SECTOR STANDS FOR?

Construction sector is a crucial component of Poland's GDP, contributing over 151.1b. PLN to Polish GDP in 2020, which amounted to approximately 6.5% of total Polish GDP.

Soundproofing your privacy

Poland is the world's largest exporter of PVC windows and doors. This is a dynamically growing category due to thermal and acoustic insulation that such windows and doors provide.

Polish construction industry boasts a number of the world's finest, eco-friendly solutions. They range from composite building materials made of PET bottles and prefabricates to energy-efficient ,passive' houses and smart home solutions.

How do others see Poland

Polish construction industry is highly regarded for its technical profficiency, talented specialists, great value for money and innovative solutions. This has been recognised by a number of high-profile foreign conglomerates that invested in Poland by opening their factories here.

But Polish businesses are also eager to expand abroad, as amply shown in the form of both greenfield and M&A investments in Germany, Ukraine, Spain (Oknoplast), the Philippines (Pietrucha group) or Romania (Selena).

Palaces and villas

The advanced energy-saving technology developed by Polish company Izodom was used in 3 000 villas built in the United Arab Emirates as well as a 10 000m² royal palace in Morocco.



Leaders in modular building

Walking down the Sixth Avenue in New York you will soon find the world's tallest modular hotel by Marriott. This 26-floors-high hotel had its modules manufactured by a Polish company DMDmodular and some experts have already considered it a major architectural achievement. Another Polish producer Polkon has been recently contracted to manufacture a prefebricated student hall for Kampala University in Uganda. Their well-regarded modules can be found in low-rise and high-rise buildings in Europe, Canada, the Carribean and both East and West coast of the US.



Connecting the world

Polish construction companies were involved in a wide range of infrastructural projects all over the world, ranging from metro systems in Almaty and Saint Petersburg, Charkov's tram tracks to a rail bridge in Stockholm and wastewater treatment plant in Riga, to name just a few.

Polish Construction Cluster

Polish Construction Cluster project is complementary to actions performed within the confines of the Business Environment Institutions Cluster – a project coordinated by the Polish Consulting Association – and is also a continuation of promotion of the clustering concept and development of ties between business and science.
